## Rapinoe changes role amid World Cup

Known for her iconic victory pose at the 2019 World Cup in France, Megan Rapinoe's on-field role on the U.S. national team is changing as the team looks to qualify for the 2023 event.

The wily winger is

now 36 and admittedly slowing a bit. Off the field, however, Rapinoe is outspoken as ever.

"I feel like I'm really enjoying and appreciating being back here and appreciating this moment and appreciating where I've been and how far I've

come, and just all the people that are that are with me and have been on this journey forever," she said. "I don't know, I feel really present in this moment."

Rapinoe is among the veterans who will play in the upcoming CONCACAF W Championship, starting Monday in Monterrey, Mexico. The tournament determines the region's four direct spots in next summer's World Cup co-hosted by Australia and New Zealand, as well as a berth at the 2024 Olympics.

The team has a bunch of new faces since it won the bronze medal at the Tokyo Games, including Sophia Smith, Ashley Sanchez, Alana Cook, Mallory Pugh and up-and-comer Trinity Rodman.

"The thing with Megan is that she is very

important for this group. I mean, obviously, this is a younger group that we're bringing in. There are lots of young players. So her experience going through adversity, going through tough times and getting on top, her mentality — winning mentality — her knowledge and understanding, is very valuable for the group," U.S. coach Vlatko Andonovski said.

Rapinoe, has scored 62 goals with 72 assists in 189 appearances with the national team since her first call-up in 2006. She scored on a penalty kick in the United States' victory over the Netherlands in the 2019 World Cup final, and had two goals in the victory over Australia for the bronze in Tokyo last summer.

But along the way she'd been unafraid to use her voice and her platform to call attention to social justice issues. As an out gay woman, she's been especially passionate about LGBTQ issues. But she was also important to the team's success in securing equitable pay with the men's national team.

She's backed up her words with action: She faced blowback for kneeling before two national team matches in 2016 in solidarity with Colin Kaepernick, the former NFL quarterback who knelt during the national anthem to draw attention to racial injustice.

# WNBA star ordered to trial in Russia

**MOSCOW (AP)** — Shackled and looking wary, WNBA star Brittney Griner was ordered Monday to stand trial by a court near Moscow on cannabis possession charges, about 4 1/2 months after her arrest at an airport while returning to play for a Russian team.

The Phoenix Mercury center and two-time U.S. Olympic gold medalist also was ordered to remain in custody for the duration of her criminal trial, which was to begin Friday. Griner could face 10 years in prison if convicted on charges of large-scale transportation of drugs. Fewer than 1% of defendants in Russian criminal cases are acquitted, and unlike in the U.S., acquittals can be over-

turned.

At Monday's closed-door preliminary hearing at the court in the Moscow suburb of Khimki, Griner's detention was extended for another six months. Photos obtained by The Associated Press showed the 31-year-old in handcuffs and looking straight ahead, unlike a previous court appearance where she kept her head

down and covered with a hood.

Her detention and trial come at an extraordinarily low point in Moscow-Washington relations. Griner was arrested at Sheremetyevo International Airport less than a week before Russia sent troops into Ukraine, which aggravated already-high tensions with sweeping sanc-

tions by the United States and Russia's denunciation of U.S. weapon supplies to Ukraine.

Amid the tensions, Griner's supporters had taken a low profile in hopes of a quiet resolution, until May, when the State Department reclassified her as wrongfully detained and shifted oversight of her case to its special presidential envoy for hostage affairs — effectively the U.S. government's chief negotiator.

Griner's wife, Cherelle,

urged President Joe Biden in May to secure her release, calling her "a political pawn."

"It was good to see her in some of those images, but it's tough. Every time's a reminder that their teammate, their friend, is wrongfully imprisoned in another country," Phoenix Mercury coach Vanessa Nygaard said later Monday. "It's tough on our team. It is good to see her. See how she's doing? I don't know if she's doing OK."

"At least we get to see an image of her. Hopefully with this trial happening quickly that some things will change and that President Biden will take the steps to ensure she comes home."

## Ukrainians win at Wimbledon amid war

**WIMBLEDON, England (AP)** — It's tough to keep your mind focused on tennis when your family's home in Ukraine is being bombed.

Anhelina Kalinina and Lesia Tsurenko did just that at Wimbledon on Monday, winning their opening matches at the grass-court Grand Slam tournament to set up a second-round meeting between the two.

"Thank God they are alive, they are safe," Kalinina said of her family, explaining that their home was destroyed in a Russian attack during the war. "But they live like many other Ukrainians, (from their) bags, so you never know what's going to happen tomorrow because everything looks like sometimes quiet. But then yesterday was two rockets in Kyiv, in the center."

The 29th-seeded Kalinina advanced to the second round by beating Anna Bondar 4-6, 6-2, 6-4. Tsurenko defeated British wild-card entry Jodie Burrage 6-2, 6-3.

"I don't feel good," said Tsurenko, who is worried because her home in the capital is close to a spot that's been under attack. "So every time is like my area, my area of the city where I live, get bombed ... I think when the war started, I start to feel this tension inside of me, and I think even if I work every day with psychologist and I try to, I don't know, anyway, try to avoid this emotions, it's impossible."

Both players won't have to face Russian or Belarusian

opponents, because athletes from those countries have been banned from competing at Wimbledon this year. As a result of that decision, no ranking points will be awarded to players during the tournament.

"I was not really happy with that decision," Tsurenko said, though she added that she agreed with the ban. "I think that the sanctions and all the sportsmen getting banned from sport from Russia and Belarus, there is a big reason for that ... I think that those decisions are right and the sanctions are right."

At the French Open, Tsurenko lamented the fact that more of her fellow players weren't coming out in support of Ukraine. But she and Kalinina have been getting plenty of support from the crowd.

One of these two will reach the third round, and they plan to talk about what they can do in their match to bring some more recognition to their country.
